This publication was designed to proide a consistent protocol in conducting club, county district and state horse judging events throughout Idaho.

OBJECTIVE

^{1.} A team mayhaw three (3) or four (4) members; then four (4) are entered, the three (3) highest ownall scores ill make up the team totals. At the club, countyand district lew, individual participation is permitted at the discretion of that contests management in order to help form teams.

^{2.} All contestants iwll report to the contest site there they ill receive full instructions and be given placing cards. All contestants ill remain ith their assigned group throughout the contest. Reasons and official placings ill be given at a location to be announced.

^{3.} While the contest is in progress, there shall be no conferring betwen the contestants and anyne else exept as directed by the Contest Superintendents or their representatives.

^{4.} No cell phones or other mobile electronic deices in be permitted into the judging contest or reasons contest areas.

^{5.} Hats maybe two at the discretion of the contest officials then judging in an outdoor setting; hats maynot be two hen judging indoors or twile giing oral reasons.

 Miniature Horses. Contestants in give oral reasons on one halter class. All halter classes
 in be judged as sound of limb, ev, ind, mouth and reproduction.
- 8. Up to four performance classes in be judged. Performance classes mayinclude, but are not limited to: Western Pleasure, Western Equitation, English Pleasure, Hunter Under Saddle, Hunt Seat Equitation, Saddle Seat Equitation, Western Riding, Reining, Western Horsemanship, Hunter Hack and driing. Oral reasons in be given on one performance class. Performance horses in be judged as seen (unsoundness to be penalized according ly.
