AT THE COURT OF BUCKINGHAM PALACE THE 16TH DAY OF JULY 2014

ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of Our other Realms and Territories Queen, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith:

WHEREAS by a Charter dated the ninth day of June 1966 Brunel University was in corporated with perpetual succession and a Common Seal:

AND WHEREAS a Petition has been presented unto Us by the Council of the University humbly praying that We would be gr aciously pleased to grant it a Supplemental Charter in order to modernise its const itutional provisions and provide for a change of name of the University :

NOW THEREFORE KNOW YE that We, having taken the said Petition into Our Royal consideration by virtue of Our Prerogative Royal and of Our especial grace, certain knowledge and mere mot ion

- 4.3 to acquire, own, maintain, manage and dispose of land and other property;
- 4.4 to solicit, receive and administer fees, charges, grants, subscript ions, donations, endowments, legacies, gifts and loans of any property whatsoever whether land or personal property and any other sources of income;
- 4.5 to act as trustee for and in relation to endowments, legacies and gifts;
- 4.6 to invest;
- 4.7 to give guarantees;

- 6.5 the approval of the University's annual audited accounts; or
- 6.6 the variation , amendme nt or revocation of the Charter , Statutes or Ordinances of the University .
- 7. Composition of Council

The Council shall consist of the following:

- 7.1 a minimum of fifteen and no more than twenty five members;
- 7.2 a majority of "independent members" being neither current employees nor students of the University, of whom one shall be the Chair of Council;
